Alberta's Clean Energy Opportunity

This talk will review the dramatic global growth in renewable energy, the clean energy economy, and Alberta's place in the burgeoning Age of Electricity. The speakers will cover significant recent trends in Alberta's electricity sector, including the impact of the wind and solar moratorium and other abrupt policy changes, and necessary outcomes of the Canada-Alberta energy and climate memorandum of understanding (MOU).

Simon Dyer is the deputy executive director of the Pembina Institute, Canada's leading clean energy think tank. Simon has worked on natural resource management issues in western Canada since 1999. Simon holds a Master of Science degree in environmental biology and ecology from the University of Alberta, and a Master of Arts in natural sciences from the University of Cambridge in the U.K.

Jason Ruochen Wang is the program manager of the Business Renewables Centre-Canada, an initiative of the Pembina Institute. Before moving to the BRCC, he worked as a senior analyst in the Institute's electricity program, focusing on Canada's net-zero electricity grid goal, electric vehicle infrastructure, and regulatory reform for utilities. Jason has a degree in mechanical engineering (University of Alberta) and an M.Sc. in Engineering and Policy Analysis (TU Delft) that focused on strategic, "deep uncertainty" thinking and the science-policy interface.
