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Dual Credit General Information

As part of our commitment to *Inspire Success* in our students, Black Gold School Division (BGSD) offers a dual credit program to high school students. Students in this program will earn college/university credits from a post-secondary institution and high school credits by completing post-secondary level coursework. This program is in partnership with Black Gold School Division, Lakeland College, Lethbridge Polytechnic, Olds College, Portage College, Northern Lakes College, Norquest College, Southern Alberta Institute of Technology (SAIT) and Alberta Education.

Dual Credit Benefits

Dual credit helps students:

- earn high school and post-secondary credits at the same time, as well as earn credits that may lead to preferred placement and workplace certification.
- get a jump-start on their post-secondary education while still in high school.
- potentially complete post-secondary with less financial debt. Through the Dual Credit Framework, high school students do not pay post-secondary tuition fees (only the cost of textbooks/supplies).
- experience what post-secondary courses are like, while still in familiar high school surroundings.
- explore future education and career interests
- gain the confidence and skills to pursue a post-secondary education

Costs

Black Gold School Division will pay all post-secondary school tuition fees for students enrolled in dual credit courses. Students will be responsible for purchasing all textbooks and required materials. These costs are indicated in the course descriptions. Information about purchasing the required materials will be provided to students once they have been accepted into the course.

Transferability

Some courses may transfer for credit at other post-secondary institutions. Course/credit transfer acceptance is always determined by the receiving institute after the student has been accepted into the program. Information about transfer agreements can be found on Transfer Alberta (<https://transferalberta.alberta.ca/>) or on the post-secondary website. Information about transfer agreements is included in the course description, however this is no way a guarantee of transferability.



Dual Credit Application Steps



Determine if Dual Credit is for You: Conversations between student, parent and high school are an important first step in the application process. Have a conversation with your school dual credit supervisor (may be the principal, assistant principal, counselor, or teacher lead) about the course you are interested in.

Prior to registering, please make sure you:

- ☐ Have the **prerequisites** and/or **corequisites** for the course.
- ☐ Have a **block of time** in your schedule dedicated to the course.
- ☐ Are **committed to completing the course**. Limited numbers of students can participate and the course requires a major commitment on behalf of the student, the parent, the high school and the Postsecondary Institute.
- ☐ Understand it is **your responsibility to purchase any textbook & materials required** for the course - Approximate costs are listed in the course descriptions and purchasing information will be provided to successful applicants.

For students who meet these requirements, schools will provide a recommendation to the BGSD dual credit lead teacher.



Application to the Dual Credit Program: For students who have been recommended, the BGSD dual credit lead teacher will contact them by email with instructions on how to complete their application. Applications must be submitted prior to the deadlines below. **Available spots will be filled on a first-come first-served basis.** Late applications *may* only be accepted if space is available. *Incomplete forms will not be accepted.*

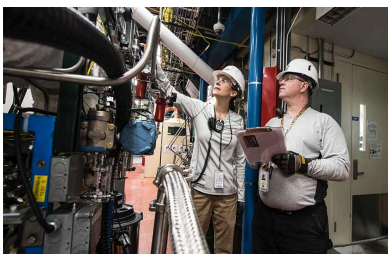

- CDEV0101: Child and Adolescent Development** (*Qualifies for Level 1 Certificate with Alberta Children's Services*)
 This course introduces students to the life cycle concept. It examines the principles, theories, and research findings that contribute to the understanding of normative development and learning in children from birth to early adolescence. Students will study the whole child's development, including social, physical, cognitive, creative, and emotional development. Students in this course will also have an opportunity to study child development from a multicultural perspective.
- ELCC0100: Introduction to Early Learning and Child Care**
 In this course students will learn what is required to work professionally and effectively in Early Learning and Child Care environments. Students become knowledgeable in the history of Early Childhood Education programs, professional ethics, codes of conduct, job descriptions and role clarifications. Students will learn their role in public policy advocacy, provincial certification requirements and quality standards in Early Childhood Programs. Socio-cultural diversity with a unique indigenous perspective is explored in these areas. In addition, policies on early childhood from the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC) and Alberta Child and Youth Services are covered.
- COM1000: Interpersonal Communications for the Helping Professions** (*Corequisite ELA 30-1 or 30-2*)
 This course covers basic communication skills (verbal, non-verbal, and written) for persons preparing to work in the helping professions. A basic overview of communication styles and methods is included. The student will learn to vary communication techniques and methods in different situations. The course emphasizes the contribution of communication skills to the development of the caring relationship between the helping professional and clients. Students will explore various concepts and principles of therapeutic communication and will consider the implications for professional practice.
- ENGL1000: Introduction to English Language Literature** (*Prerequisite ELA 30-1 (60%) or 30-2 (70%)*)
 This introductory university level English course explores various genres of literature with an emphasis on "the essay". We will also complete a novel study. The course will provide formal instruction with writing university-level essays; about one half of the course will be spent on writing instruction. Regarding grammar, this course is not considered remedial.
- ELCC0105: Health, Nutrition, and Safety**
 The nourishment, good health practice, and safety of children during their first years of life have an impact on their overall development, growth, and well-being. The focus of this course will be on promoting quality, safe and healthy Early Learning Environments. Specific issues addressed will include health promotion, proper nutrition, common illnesses, child abuse and maltreatment as well as methods for creating safe and caring environments. The blending of current theory and practical application in the topics of health,

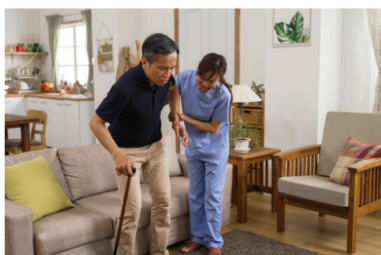
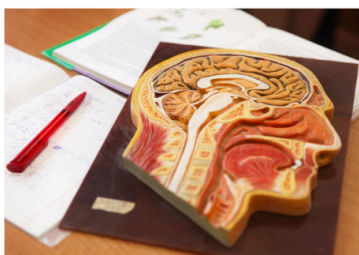
Solving Technology Problems
